**New York Supreme Court Leverages
Courtroom Connect's Video Streaming Technology
To Better Serve the Public**

(Atlanta, GA) July 6, 2006 - Courtroom Connect (CC), the leading provider of advanced communication services tailored to the legal industry, including videoconferencing, video streaming, and Internet, is now helping courts become more efficient by streaming live video of proceedings to overflow rooms within the courthouse. In *Knickerbocker Village Tenants Association v. Calogero*, 103200/2006, Justice Walter B. Tolub of the New York Supreme Court chose to manage his high-profile case by using Courtroom Connect's video streaming technology. To handle the overflow crowd, the court arranged for more than 300 seats to be set up in the rotunda at 60 Centre Street, where the proceedings were broadcast via Courtroom Connect's video streaming solution. The proceedings were projected onto a screen for all to view in real time. The result was that the hearing ran smoothly and without disruption. Hundreds of citizens were able to view the proceedings that otherwise would have been turned away. Justice Walter B. Tolub had this to say, "The role of the court is to serve the public interest. This was a very high-profile case with hundreds of interested parties. Without Courtroom Connect's video streaming technology, we would have had to turn away almost 300 individuals. With Courtroom Connect's video streaming service, it was very easy to manage the overflow of people who came to witness this important hearing."

Lawyers for tenants of Knickerbocker Village, an affordable-housing development in Manhattan's East Village, appeared in Supreme Court in an attempt to annul a decision by the commissioner of the state Division of Housing and Community Renewal that would allow the Mitchell Lama development's owners to transfer it to a private entity. The tenants' Article 78 petition claimed that the commissioner's "consent to dissolve is arbitrary and capricious." Justice Tolub presided over the hearing.
